Required Individual Gear

- Official full BSA uniform¹
- Scout activity uniform²
- Underwear and socks
- Windbreaker or jacket (evenings can be cool)
- Rain gear
- Sleepwear
- Handkerchief or bandana
- Shoes or boots appropriate for hiking and outdoor activities
- Unscented toiletries
- Working gloves for conservation project
- Towel & washcloth
- Flashlight with spare batteries/bulb
- Cup or mug, plastic or metal (no glass)
- Mess kit & dunk bag
- Pocketknife or multi-tool (no fixed-blade knives)
- Personal medication in labeled containers
- Pens or pencils for note-taking
- Handbook for your Scouting program
- Backpack suitable for 2 days/nights of camping
- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Folding camp chair (no loungers)
- Water Bottles (two 32oz. recommended)

Required Group Gear

The following items will need to be provided by some of the participants. If you have these items, please bring them. If you don't have these items, don't buy them just for the course. Please note that tents, beds with mattresses and all food are provided.

- Small backpacking stove and fuel (to heat water for rehydrated food)
- Cooking pots (2 quart)
- Serving spoons
- Hot pot pliers
- Spice kit

Suggested

- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen & lip balm
- Insect repellent
- Books of camp songs, skits, etc.
- Religious books
- Camera and appropriate accessories
- Extra shoes and moccasins or camp slippers³
- Day pack or fanny-pack for rain gear, etc.
- Zip Lock bags (gallon size)
- Luggage tags

Electronics

Electronic devices may not be used during the course. Cell phones are allowed but must be turned off or silenced to prevent disruption during course activities. Calls are only allowed during personal free time. Wi-Fi internet is available around the Philmont Training Center for use with your Wi-Fi enabled laptop.

Bears

Because Philmont is in bear country, there are several precautions that must be taken. Information is available on the Wood Badge 110 web site in the Resources section and will be discussed at Participant Orientation and at Philmont. When gathering your gear for the trip, please purchase unscented items as noted on the checklist. You should also bring several "zip lock" style bags to store smellables.

¹ An official uniform is the uniform for your current Scouting position. It includes the official BSA Scout shirt; shoulder loops; BSA shorts, long/short pants, skirt or culottes; BSA socks; and BSA leather or web belt. Please do not wear the BSA white activity socks.

² An activity uniform is the exact same as your field uniform except you will wear the WB110 course activity t-shirt instead of your BSA program shirt.

³ Please note that open toe shoes are not permitted.
